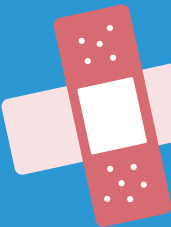
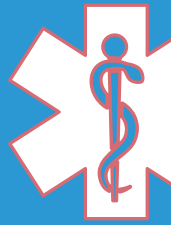




VOTER VITALS: A HEALTH CARE TRACKING POLL

November 2021 Edition

Voter Vitals' latest edition shows that lowering costs remains the top health care priority for voters of all parties. The vast majority prefer for lawmakers to build on our current health care system rather than create the public option, create a government-run plan for those in states that did not expand Medicaid, or open up Medicare to younger Americans. Most voters are unwilling to pay any more in taxes or health care costs to create a new government-run health insurance system.

HEALTH CARE POLICY

- Lowering **COSTS** (67%) remains the top health care priority for Democratic, Swing, and Republican voters.
- 75% of voters with health insurance coverage are **SATISFIED** with their coverage.
- Support for government-run proposals remains **LOW** – including for Medicare for All (45%, +0% since August) and the public option (47%, +1% since August).
- 65% prefer **BUILDING ON** our current system rather than creating the public option or opening up Medicare – including a majority of Democratic voters.
- Voters prefer to build on what's **WORKING** by providing subsidies for those in states that did not expand Medicaid to purchase coverage in the existing marketplace (57%) over creating a new government-run insurance plan (43%).
- An increasing majority are **CONCERNED** about limiting access to quality care (74%, +3% since August), increasing payroll taxes (70%, +3% since August), and bankrupting the Medicare HIT Fund (70%, +3% since August) to expand Medicare.
